Developmental/Additional Requirements:

Based on assessment testing results, students are placed in appropriate level courses (developmental or college level). Students without SAT / ACT / in-house assessment scores will be scheduled for three developmental courses (Reading for College, Basic Writing Skills, and Basic Math Skills). These courses must be successfully completed before a student may enroll in required English / math courses.

Professional Studies with a Pre Allied Health Intent (PSAH) students need to work with their academic advisor to review the pre allied health program guidelines/ requirements. At the completion of this coursework, if the student is still not eligible for admission to the pre allied health program, he/she must declare a new major. Students also need to be aware that, if accepted into the pre allied health program, they will not be able to complete the remaining coursework in a two-year timeframe.
